In simple terms, a vocation is a calling from God. To respond to the question ‘What does God want me to be?’

We are all called to holiness, this call is rooted in our baptism. It is a call to know, love and serve the Lord. We feel a growing desire to love God and to have a deeper understanding with Him. We come to understand that there is a reason for our existence and there is meaning in our lives.

Each vocation is a call to follow God closely. We can be called ‘to be holy’ individually, through married life, consecrated life or through ordained ministry.

For those who lead a consecrated life, their path of following Christ is through their vows of chastity, poverty and obedience.

For those who have chosen the ordained ministry, they share in the priesthood of Christ in a special way. They represent Christ the Good Shepherd for God's people and Christ as the Head of the Church.

ST CATHERINE OF SIENA

St Catherine was one of the most brilliant theological minds of her day, although she never had any formal education. She ranks high among the mystics and spiritual writers of the Church and remains a greatly respected figure for her spiritual writings, and political boldness to “speak truth to power” - this was exceptional for a woman, in her time period.
